



LIBRARY UPDATES REFERENCE RESOURCES PAGE AND ADDS NEW GENEALOGY AND LOCAL HISTORY WEBPAGE



In November the library updated its Research menu on the library website. This menu is located along the top of the library website and is intended to help patrons find popular resources and topics quickly and easily. It includes individual resources such as Consumer Reports, resources by topics such as legal and health information, as well as an A-Z listing of all the library research and reference resources.

The Genealogy and Local History webpage, located under this menu, replaces the old Genealogy webpage and includes new local history resources not previously found on the library's website. "We wanted to make heavily used resources available while also highlighting resources that were previously inaccessible to the public," says Reference Librarian Mark Burdette. This includes lists of architectural drawings and microfilm containing newspapers, census, and county records. Patrons will also find an annotated bibliography of local history titles and links to important local resources such as WHKP recordings and Henderson County resources held at the North Carolina Digital Heritage Center. In this column we feature books and authors with regional appeal to Western North Carolina and more broadly, with a strong sense of place in the Southeast. Place any of these on hold at the library through the NC Cardinal catalog.

In serial mysteries and thrillers, Julia Keller's West Virginia series featuring a female DA continues with *The Cold Way Home*, and J.D. Rhoades' Jack Keller is back in North Carolina in a new hard boiled mystery called *Won't Back Down*. In Hank Early's *Echoes of the Fall*, the southern gothic series follows North Georgia small town cop Earl Marcus, a long-buried missing persons case is uncovered in *Cold Woods* by Karen Katchur, and a ghostly figure appears to be digging a tunnel through the mountains in Jess Montgomery's *The Hollows*. The novella *Exit Fee* by blockbuster thriller author Brad Taylor takes place in Charleston, and another popular Charleston writer Karen White has a ghostly holiday novel with *The Christmas Spirits on Tradd Street*.

For cozy titles, Amy Patricia Meade's <u>The Garden Club Murder</u> is the sequel to last year's literary caterer Tish Tarragon mystery <u>Cookin' The Books</u>. Ellen Crosby continues her wine country mysteries with <u>The Angels' Share</u>. For stories about young mothers, look for local author Meagan Lucas' new book <u>Songbirds and Stray Dogs</u>, set in Western North Carolina, or <u>Holding on to Nothing</u> by Elizabeth Chiles Shelburne, about a girl thwarted trying to leave her small town in Tennessee. If you like books about families and social issues like Jodi Picoult, <u>Invisible as Air</u> by Zoe Fishman deals with depression and addiction after a mother loses a child. A Southern family history told through artifacts called <u>The Last List of Miss Judith Kratt</u> by Andrea Bobotis is a new debut, and for a family saga in the vein of Pat Conroy, try John Russell's <u>All the Right Circles</u>, about power and prestige in the South.

In romance, Liz Johnson's Georgia Coast Romance sequel features pirate tours in *A Glitter of Gold*. If you're looking for clean romantic suspense like Dee Henderson, Dani Pettrey's Coastal Guardians series kicks off with *The Killing Tide*. For Christian historical fiction, try the Daughters of the Mayflower series title *The Rebel Bride* by Shannon McNear about a Civil War nurse in Tennessee, and Ted Dekker has a new book about a secretive religious community in a hidden valley holding off the apocalypse called *The Girl Behind the Red Rope*.

For nonfiction and memoir, Appalachian documentarian Charles D. Thompson Jr. writes about the forces squeezing family farms in Virginia in *Going Over Home*, and a revised edition of *The Foxfire Book of Appalachian Cookery* by T. J. Smith is now available. A couple local history titles specific to Henderson County include the *Guide to Antebellum Flat Rock* by C. Phillip Elliott and *Gun Fights, Dam Sites, and Water Rights* by James E. Brittain. For a true crime story, *The Third Rainbow Girl* by Emma Copley Eisenberg covers a double murder in early twentieth-century West Virginia. Mixing family and North Carolina history, *Memoir of a Race Traitor* by Mab Segrest was recently republished, and *Late Migrations* by Margaret Renkl is a regional memoir connecting a tribute to aging parents to the natural world of Alabama and Tennessee.

My literary top picks include a folk horror novel set in the North Carolina woods called *The Twisted Ones* by T. Kingfisher, and a novel about herbalists of the North Georgia mountains by Tim Westover called *The Winter Sisters*. A familiar tale about people finding their place in a larger narrative of modernization and displacement, a new book by Mark Barr called *Watershed* chronicles the changes that electricity brought to a

Tennessee community with the damming of a river valley. Lastly, the collected stories of Southern cult fiction writer Larry Brown was published with the title <u>Tiny Love</u>. Looking ahead to forthcoming popular fiction, local favorite Diane Chamberlain describes the layers of a piece of North Carolina public art dating back to the 1940s in *Big Lies in a Small Town*.


NEW STATUE AT MILLS RIVER

UPCOMING BOOK CLUB MEETINGS





TEACHING BEYOND LIBRARY WALLS

As an instructional librarian I have taught many computer classes in the library. Recently, I have been given the opportunity to take these classes out into the community. Two sites we now offer computer classes at are the Goodwill Career Connections and the Sammy Williams Center, both in Hendersonville.

In January, a new series of classes will begin at both sites. The classes at Goodwill will focus on the computer skills job seekers need, such as filling out online job applications, while classes at the Sammy Williams Center will cover computer basics. Classes at Goodwill are open to the public for up to 10 people while classes at the Sammy Williams Center are for those who attend the program there. Schedules for both sites will be confirmed in late December.

THE FRIENDS OF THE LIBRARY

The Friends play an important role in the community by supporting all six branches of the library. Even though we are an all-volunteer organization, we raise about \$100,000 a year, mostly from our book sales in May and September.

Between January and September of 2019, we sponsored 128 programs and purchased 1,000 books for the library. We also bought tablets, AV items, materials for the Craft Club, and furniture and equipment such as chairs, security cameras, and shelf units.

Our organization continues to grow. We currently have almost 1,500 members. With 400 new members in 2019, we have increased our total membership by 39 percent compared to the year before.
